COMMUNITY NEWS

February is typically the coldest month of the year, and we want to help everyone stay safe, warm, and prepared as temperatures drop.

Here are a few tips and reminders during freezing conditions:

- Protect your pipes by letting faucets drip slightly, opening cabinet doors to allow warm air to circulate, and insulating any exposed plumbing.
- Set your thermostat no lower than 60 degrees and never turn your heat off, even if you are away.
- Make sure your heat registers or baseboard heaters are not obstructed.
- Prepare for icy conditions by keeping salt or ice melt on hand for walkways and steps, and use caution when walking or driving.
- Bring pets indoors and limit their time outside during extreme cold to keep them safe.
- Keep your garage door closed.

Friendly Community Reminders

Community Speed Limit – For everyone's safety, please remember that the community speed limit is 15 MPH.

Children are often outside playing, and staying within the posted limit helps keep our neighborhood safe and enjoyable for all. Thank you for doing your part to drive carefully and look out for one another.

Winter Snow & Parking – It is extremely important to refrain from parking on the roadway. Parking is not permitted on all roadways during impending or active snowfalls and freezing rain/sleet. Vehicles must be removed prior to a storm so that road surfaces can be effectively pretreated. Any vehicle left on the roadway during snow removal, sleet, or treatment will be subject to towing at the owner's expense. Parking on the grass is not permitted. Residents may temporarily use the community center parking lot during snowfall, prior to the roads being plowed, if needed. Parking on the grass is not permitted.
